A total of £9430 was allocated, £3730 was carried forward into 2016-17

<p><b>Increase the range of opportunities and number of pupils participating in extra-curricular clubs</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Specialist coaches employed</li> <li>• Support for staff to run clubs provided</li> </ul>	<p>Specialist coaching in out of school hours clubs has impacted on the range of extra curricular opportunities we are able to offer in both KS 1 and 2. We now offer fundamental movement clubs for our EYFS and K1 pupils 6 pupils attended in 2015 and by June 16 this had increased to 23 pupils. We opened our football after school provision to Years 1- 6 this started with only 16 pupils attending and rose to 50 pupils in the summer of 2016, this did include a number of girls. The subsequent impact of this increased participation was that we created Y4, 5, and 6 football teams and they played in a local league. Year 5 and 6 won their leagues!            Our newly improved Kwik Cricket club specifically targeted year 6 girls participation. This resulted in a team reaching the National Kwik Cricket Finals.            With these successes, pupils enjoyment and enthusiasm for PE participation was noticeably higher than in May 2015 – this was evidenced via our pupil interviews in May 2016- 100% enjoyed PE.            Our Coach is also an excellent male role model for our pupils and has resulted in further improvement in behaviour and participation levels. These attitudes will be built upon and <b>sustained</b> in future years and skill levels further enhanced and developed.</p>
