We will be looking for children to be reading at home with their parents. Listening to children read will enable them to grow in confidence as they become fluent readers. Once children are able to read fluently, and with expression, hold discussions around their comprehension of the texts, (we will provide a bank of ideas to support this). If your child is reluctant to read, they could listen to audio books. We want them to foster a love of books, so please don't underestimate the value of reading to your child. We are all very grateful for your support.

Added Extras:


We will encourage your child to complete as many of the activities from the menu as they like at home, but NO LESS than 3 over the half term, This can be recorded (if appropriate) in our homework books. We will ask for homework books in during the last week of each half term in order for us to share and celebrate this learning.

Read it

Share a story that is set in the woods with someone in your house. Can you answer the following questions?

- What is the title of the book?
- Who are the main characters?
- What happened at the beginning, middle and end of the story?
- Can you find any letters that you recognise?

Can you draw a picture of one of the characters from the story and talk about it? Think carefully about the circles and lines that we have been practising.



Research it

Can you research the names of all Seven Dwarfs from the story Snow White?

- You could read the story and draw them.
- You could research the story on the computer.
- You could talk to someone who knows the story.



Design it

Oh No! Goldilocks has broken baby bear's chair. Can you design a new chair for baby bear? What colour will it be? Can you draw your design and talk about it? Ask your mummy or daddy to write down what you say.



Practise it

Can you practise counting different amounts of objects up to 10?

- Find a selection of objects in your house and count them.
- Can you count up to 10 objects?
- Can you find a different 10 objects?
- Can you draw some of the objects that you have counted and try to write the number?



Write it

Can you go on a nature hunt and draw what you find?

- You could go for a walk in the woods, in the park, or in your garden.
- Talk about the things that you can see.
- Can you draw some of them? What shapes can you use?
- Talk about your drawing and ask your mummy or daddy to write down what you say.



Make it

Can you make an Easter card for someone special?

- Can you make a front cover for your card and talk about it?
- Can you copy some letters inside your card to show who it is for?
- Can you try to copy some of the letters in your name?
