



Set Menu: Daily reading

We will be looking for children to be reading at home with their parents. Listening to children read will enable them to grow in confidence as they become fluent readers. Once children are able to read fluently, and with expression, hold discussions around their comprehension of the texts, (we will provide a bank of ideas to support this). If your child is reluctant to read, they could listen to audio books. We want them to foster a love of books, so please don't underestimate the value of reading to your child. We are all very grateful for your support.

Added Extras:

We will encourage your child to complete as many of the activities from the menu as they like at home, but NO LESS than 3 over the half term, This can be recorded (if appropriate) in our homework books. We will ask for homework books in during the last week of each half term in order for us to share and celebrate this learning.

Read it

Can you read your favourite animal story with someone in your family?

- What is the title of the book?
- Who were the main characters?
- What happened in the story?
- Can you draw some of the characters and try to label them?

Ask a grown up to write what you say.



Research it

Can you research a variety of sea creatures? What did you find out? Can you find out what the biggest sea creature is?

Can you draw a picture of your favourite sea creature and talk about why you like it?



Design it/ Make it

Can you make an Easter card for someone special?

- Can you make a front cover for your card and talk about it?
- Can you copy some letters inside your card to show who it is for?
- Can you try to copy some of the letters in your name?



Practise it

We are working really hard in nursery at trying to write our name.

Can you keep practising copying the letters in your first name?

- Have some fun and practise writing your name in sand, shaving foam, paint, mud or even with sticks. Ask a grown up to take a photo for you to stick in your homework book.
- Now practise writing it using some nice coloured pencils in your homework book.

Make sure you are forming your letters correctly with a whoosh and flick!



Write it

My favourite animal is a Giraffe!
Can you draw a picture of your favourite animal?

- Think about the shape of the animal and the colour.
- Can you label your animal? What sound does it start with? Try to copy the letters carefully.
- Remember to hold your pencil using your crocodile fingers.
- Why is it your favourite animal? Ask a grown up to write what you say.



E-Learn it
